Memorandum No. 1

Subject: Research Contract with Stanford University.

The Staff recommends that the Commission enter into a research contract with Stanford University. The recommended amount of the contract is \$3,000, to be expended roughly as follows:

Index for bound volume of reports . . . . . \$1,000  
John McDonough - preparation of recommendations  
and revised rules on hearsay . . . . . \$1,000  
Research and cite checking, etc., in connection  
with publications during balance of fiscal  
year . . . . . \$1,000

In the past, research contracts have been made with Stanford University covering the periods indicated and for the amounts indicated:

<u>Fiscal year</u>	<u>Amount</u>
1954-55	\$3,000
1955-56	2,000
1956-57	2,500
1957-58	2,500
1958-59	2,250
1959-60	None budgeted, \$3,000 proposed

The proposed contract would take the same form as contracts in the past have taken. These contracts cover research in connection with the determination of new topics for study by the Commission (none of the \$3,000 would be used for this purpose) and "legal research and related studies as may be requested by the Law Revision Commission through its Executive Secretary in connection with the research program of the Commission."

We have sufficient funds in other categories in the budget to cover this contract.
