## 2023 Legislative Program (Status Report)

As described below, the staff has found authors willing to introduce bills to implement the Commission's 2023 Legislative Program.<sup>1</sup> The staff is grateful for their assistance.

## Administrative Subpoena

Assembly Member Kalra (the current Assembly Member of the Law Revision Commission) has agreed to introduce a bill to implement the Commission's recommendation on *State and Local Agency Access to Electronic Communications: Notice of Administrative Subpoena* (Mar. 2022).

#### Fish and Game

The Assembly Committee on Water, Parks, and Wildlife has agreed to introduce a committee bill to implement the Commission's recommendation on *Fish and Game Law: Technical Revisions and Minor Substantive Improvements (Part 3)*. The Commission approved the proposed legislation in that recommendation at its January 2023 meeting.<sup>2</sup> Approval of the narrative part of the recommendation is on the agenda for the February 2023 meeting.<sup>3</sup>

#### **Trial Court Unification**

The Assembly Committee on Judiciary has agreed to include the following recommendations in a committee bill:

(1) Statutes Made Obsolete by Trial Court Restructuring: Part 8 (Jan. 2022).
