Carrillo Elected Chair of Law Revision Commission

David A. Carrillo, of Berkeley, has been elected Chairperson of the California Law Revision Commission and Amb. (r) David Huebner, of Palm Springs, has been elected Vice-Chairperson. The term of office is one year, ending on August 31, 2023.

The Law Revision Commission is a state agency responsible for studying problem areas in California law and recommending reforms to the Governor and Legislature. The Commission's current workload includes studies of antitrust law, the Equal Rights Amendment, emergency-related reforms, and the reorganization and clean-up of the Fish and Game Code and certain statutes that regulate toxic substances.

David A. Carrillo, the new Chairperson, was appointed to the Commission in 2019. He has been executive director of the California Constitution Center and lecturer in residence at the University of California, Berkeley School of Law since 2012. He was previously a deputy attorney general for the California Department of Justice from 2001 to 2003 and from 2007 to 2012, a deputy city attorney for the City and County of San Francisco from 2003 to 2007, a litigation associate in private practice from 1999 to 2001, and a deputy district attorney for Contra Costa County from 1995 to 1998. Commissioner Carrillo received Juris Doctor, Master of Laws, and Doctor of the Science of Jurisprudence degrees from the University of California, Berkeley School of Law.

David Huebner, the new Vice-Chairperson, was appointed to the Commission in 2022. He previously served as a member of the Commission from 1999 to 2003 and 2005 to 2007, including three terms as Chairperson. Huebner has been an Arbitrator and Mediator, affiliated with JAMS, since 2017. He served as U.S. Ambassador to New Zealand and the Independent State of Samoa from 2009 to 2014. Licensed to practice law in California, New York, District of Columbia, and England & Wales, Huebner spent approximately twenty years as a partner in international law firms, including one in which he served as chairman and CEO. Huebner was an Adjunct Professor of international law at the University of Southern California Gould School of Law from 1999 to 2007 and has lectured at other universities in the U.S., China, and New Zealand. Huebner earned a Bachelor of Arts, *summa cum laude*, from Princeton University and a Juris Doctor degree from Yale Law School.
